

North Cadbury and Yarlington Parish Council Rights of Way Report – October 2020

Works completed

WN 19/78 Path in its northern sector has been reinstated and vegetation cut down. Path deviates slightly, emerging onto concrete track slightly further south. Gate and signage has been moved to this point.

Outstanding Issues

WN 19/78 ROW officer has agreed to replace gate at southern entrance to this footpath.

WN 31/7 Tree down and foliage blocking path.

WN 19/105 Restricted byway still in deplorable state. Notices prohibiting vehicles have been placed at each end. Issue of the bollards still unresolved.

WN 19/95 Bridge to be re-built.

WN 19/1 (Smallway Lane east) access overgrown, broken stile, no finger post and southern end at junction with Frog Lane no access, overgrown, no stile or way marking. Path has been in this state for at least 7 months. Uncertain who owns the land – possibly Mount Pleasant Farm Holdings.

WN 19/27 at junction with 19/97 Dangerous stile.

WN 19/101 Gate at eastern end is dangerous. It drops on its hinges and latching post is beginning to collapse. No response from land owners. Now in the hands of ROW officer.

WN 19/27 Eastern section impassable due of maize planting.

WN 22/16 Impassable due to maize planting. Landowner unknown.

Manor Farm No indication of route through farmyard at the end of Sleight Lane Track. Confusing for walkers. PPLO and KV have offered to place waymarks. No response from landowner.

WN 19/38 Crop has grown over the footpath. Sue Seager informed.

Circular walks project

Have been awarded £1500 from Somerset Community Foundation. Display boards have been ordered. PPLO continues to work on routes for walks.
