Potholes

The speed of repair of potholes is improving and I am pleased to say that the two quite nasty ones on Hearn Lane and Frog Lane have now been repaired. Members of the public are reminded that it is now easy to report a pothole through the website “**Somerset County Council - Report a problem on the road**” This site also covers such problems as overgrown hedges, damaged road signs, flooding issues etc.

Overall the lanes are now in reasonable condition although we continue to see degradation of the edges of the road surface caused by wide agricultural vehicles but there is no budget available to deal with this aspect.

Road Signage

There has been recent upgrading of road surface signage in North Cadbury, Woolston and Yarlington although they appear to have missed Crockers Hill where SLOW signs on the road are almost obliterated. There has been no such upgrading in Galhampton yet.

We still await replacement signs along the narrow part of the road through Woolston and one of the chevrons on the bend at Three Ashes on the A359 needs to be repaired.
